Horseshoe Draw/Palominas Water Recharge Projects Tour

Why was this project or program important?

Horseshoe Draw (HNRCD Project) & Palominas Water Recharge Project (Cochise County project) are completed projects concerning water recharge to the San Pedro River. Because of the physical site of these projects HNRCD felt not enough people at the State level were aware of what the District is involved with. This tour was an important tool in educating AZ State legislators and some general public attendees about the projects and what they are contributing to the San Pedro River.

Project or program summary:

Were key partners involved in collaborating on this project/program?

Water recharge to the San Pedro River is of critical concern to the HNRCD and Cochise County. Horseshoe Draw Project and Palominas Water Recharge Project are two completed large scale projects that have demonstrated their benefit to the river since their completion. The tour consisted of a Power Point presentation to the group, guided site visits to both projects, followed by lunch with the opportunity to discuss the projects. Over 50 people attended the tour. The main objective was to educate AZ legislators on what kind of projects the HNRCD is involved in and this objective was met.

Managed Grazing on the SPRNCA

Why was this project or program important?

The San Pedro River National Conservation Area (SPRNCA) managed by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) lies within the HNRCD and is important to the District because what happens in SPRNCA affects the District's economy, natural resources, and health of the land.

Project or program summary:

Were key partners involved in collaborating on this project/program?

Since 2014 HNRCD has been involved in coordination meetings with BLM over the SPRNCA. BLM's Resource Management Plan (RMP) was being overhauled and newly written and HNRCD had consistently presented proven and concise concepts on why managed grazing should be allowed on the SPRNCA. October, 2017 was the last coordination meeting with BLM because after that meeting BLM elected to engage only in cooperation meetings. The legalities between coordination and cooperation demanded HNRCD stay with coordination. Therefore, submitting a public comment letter to BLM on the release of their proposed RMP was the only available option left to HNRCD. HNRCD agreed with BLM's preferred alternative in the proposed RMP on their Alternative C which

allowed some managed grazing on SPRNCA but overall public input did not agree. The objective to coordinate with the BLM was met but the overall objective to gain managed grazing on SPRNCA was not met due to public objections.

The presentations included 1) an overview of conventional rangeland monitoring and an overview of rangeland monitoring in southern Cochise County, 2) video presentations taken by drones showing before and after views of brush management and grassland restoration, 3) slide presentations of drone use before, during, and after the HNRCD Horseshoe Draw Project and how drones are being used to monitor the Horseshoe Draw Project, 4) slide and video presentations accentuating the many and varied uses of drones in agriculture and resource management, and 5) slide presentations of drone use in rangeland monitoring. The objective to pass along information on drones was met.
